

## Girls Outperform Boys In Technology, Literacy

A test developed by The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) was first used in 2014. It is designed to be administered to 8th graders every four years. The test is called Technology and Engineering Literacy (TEL). In 2018 it was used by 600 schools and 15,400 8th graders took the assessment.

The test along with standard multiple choice questions also posed scenario-based performance

tasks. The makers of the test indicate this is an effort to prevent teachers from teaching to the test. Both the results in 2014 and 2018 had girls outperform boys and the girls did particularly better on the scenario-based problems.

While non-educators might say the girls finally are doing better than boys, but educators are not shocked. In my years as an administrator, the girls were always the top students in the 8th grade and always the valedictorians.

The National Center is attempting to judge if the student can participate and intelligently answer questions in the real world arena. The NCES is hoping to expand the test to include 4th and 12th graders. They claim it can help prepare students to enter STEM schools. The main problem is do our students need still another standardized test? The administration and the different Boards of Education will have to make that decision. If you believe strongly either way, express your concern at the local school.

## Music Festival In Grant Park

The Grant Park Music Festival now open through Aug. 17th, continues its commitment to Festival Connect, its comprehensive initiative aimed to increase music education and engagement opportunities for audiences of all ages. Working with the Chicago Park District's Night Out in the Parks program, Festival Connect will continue to focus on the neighborhoods with performances by the Grant Park Orchestra, the Grant Park Chorus, and Project Inclusion Vocal and String Fellows.

The Festival hosts Classical Campers, its half-day music immersion program for children ages 6-12, in collaboration with the Chicago Park District. Over 1,800 students will learn about the instruments and sections of the orchestra with educators and fellows, take part in hands-on musical activities,

and conclude their day with a visit to a Festival rehearsal and talk-back with orchestra members.

On Fridays at 5:30 p.m. before the Grant Park orchestra takes the stage, audiences are treated to concerts by students from music schools and summer music programs at the front of the Great Lawn at the Jay Pritzker Pavilion. 
