Girls Outperform Boys In Technology, Literacy

A test developed by The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) was first used in 2014. It is designed to be administered to 8th graders every four years. The test is called Technology and Engineering Literacy (TEL). In 2018 it was used by 600 schools and 15,400 8th graders took

The test along with standard multiple choice questions also posed scenario-based performance

the assessment.

tasks. The makers of the test indicate this is an effort to prevent teachers from teaching to the test. Both the results in 2014 and 2018 had girls outperform boys and the girls did particularly better on the scenario-based

While non-educators might say the girls finally are doing better than boys, but educators are not shocked. In my years as an administrator, the girls were always the top students in the 8th grade and always the valedicto-






