MasterCard Phone Scam

Another phone scam has resurfaced in north-ern Illinois. Consumers have reported that they are receiving automated messages stating their MasterCard has been hacked and that they need to call and verify their information so that a new card can be issued.

The Better Business Bureau is alerting consumers to these calls and warns that if an automated system calls asking for credit card information it's probably a scam.

The scammers are after the card number and expiration date but more importantly the security code, making it possible for them to use the card for online purchases.

The consumer is asked to "press 1" to speak to an operator who will then ask for the information on the card. In other instances, the request will be to "press 1" to fix the issues with the card and a pre-recorded voice will give instructions to enter the 16-digit card number, the expiration date, and the security

Unemployment Rate Declines to 5.9 %

The Illinois Department of Employment Security announced that the unemployment rate in June declined to 5.9 percent and nonfarm payroll employment shed -7,500 jobs, based on preliminary data released by the Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The state's unemployment rate is higher than the national unemployment rate reported for June, which fell from the prior month to 5.3 percent. The BLS revised May data, which showed a smaller increase in Illi-

nois' job gain from a pre-liminary +9,200 to +7,400. Illinois' labor force has decreased by 33,600 people and the number of residents employed from that time has declined by 17,600, since January 2015. IDES analysts estimate that the number of jobs will not reach pre-recession levels until approximately September

"The drop in the number of unemployed Illinois residents since the beginning of this year is not entirely attributable to people finding jobs, rather to people leaving Illinois' workforce altogether," said IDES Director Jeff Mays. "This factor must be considered when highlighting lower unemploy-

ment numbers.' In June, the three industry sectors with the largest gains in employment were: Trade, Transportation and Utilities (+4,500), Financial Activities (+2,200) and Educational and Health Services (+1,000). The three industry sectors with the largest declines in employment were Construction (-4,700); Other Services (-3,200); and

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Park District General Superintendent Michael P. Kelly invite residents to enjoy the Malkin-Sacks Climbing Walls at Maggie Daley Park, 337 E. Randolph st.

The maximum height of the walls is approximately 40 feet over a total surface area of 19,000 square feet. Between 25 and 100 climbers can use the facility at one time.

The walls are divided into different sections for beginners and advanced climbers, accommodating bouldering, lead-harnessed and top rope climbing. Bouldering is climbing at heights less than 12-15 feet without rope. Top rope climbing is climbing at up to 40 feet with a harness. To ensure safety, a spotter is required for each boulderer and a belayer is required for each climber.

First-time participants must attend a certification class: bouldering costs \$15 and lasts about 15 minutes, and climbing costs \$29 and lasts 45-60 minutes. New climbers may also use auto-belay equipment at \$45 per hour or take private lessons at \$45 per 30 minutes to climb im-
