

Parents of 8th grade students, another decision is on hand. This Saturday, Jan. 9th, the Archdiocese of Chicago is holding entrance exams for all those interested in attending one of Chicago's Catholic High Schools next Fall.

Years ago, numerous Catholic High Schools were the real choice of people in our community. Since Religious Orders serving all these schools have had a lack of vocations for many years now, things are not the same. The years of cheap labor for schools has ceased to exist. We realize lay teachers cost more than Brothers and Sisters, even though it is no where near their true worth to the community. It has caused tuition to be made unaffordable for

I have had many discussions with parents and parent groups on the issue. Some say I can't afford it when the public schools are free, still others say I can afford tuition for the elementary school or the high school, not both. The parents in general have the arguments that fall into two categories. Some think the money that is available should be spent in the grade schools so that the kids get a solid faithbased start in education and receive the help needed to make their sacraments. On the other hand, the parents consider high school a far more dangerous and daunting place. They know bullying exists everywhere but they have an agreement that the Catholic high

New Rules For Drone Flights

The Illinois Department of Transportation urges the public to get up to speed on safety guidelines before going air-

borne with drones. "While drones can be a lot of fun and make a great gift, they also come with a responsibility, said Illinois Transportation Secretary Randy Blankenhorn. "Safety always should be the top priority. We are asking both recreational and commercial drone users to take some time to become familiar with a few commonsense rules and avoid running into turbulence.

The Federal Aviation Administration is predicting as many as one million unmanned aerial vehicles -- drones or UAVs -- to be sold during the holiday season. Aircraft pilots have encountered UAVs while in flight more than 650 times this year.

According to federal regulations, all drones are considered aircraft. even ones purchased at your local department store. When you fly a drone in the nation's airspace, you become a pilot.

Before taking to the skies, please go through a preflight checklist: Do not fly your drone more than 400 feet above the ground. Always maintain a line of sight with the drone when you are flying. Federal rules prohibit drones from being flown within five miles of an airport, without first contacting the airport. Avoid flying over large groups of people, including stadiums and sports events, or emergency response efforts, such as fires or traffic accidents. Do not fly under the influence.

Gov. Bruce Rauner has created the Unmanned Aerial System Oversight Task Force to decide rules for drones in Illinois.

Recommendations are due July 1st. For more information on drone safety, visit KnowBeforeYouFly.Org. The FAA requires that UAVs used for recreational purposes to be registered prior to operation outdoors, if they are purchased on or after Dec. Study Habits Of River Otters

A century after near-extinction from the State of Illinois and decades after reintroduction, an urban river otter has found its way into the southern region of the Forest Preserves of Cook County, calling an isolated pond within the preserves home.

The Forest Preserves of Cook County and the Chicago Zoological Society, which operates Brookfield Zoo, have collaborated to study the otter's behavior. Veterinarians implanted a transmitter in the otter, allowing wildlife biologists to track how the animal moves and learn how far it travels from its home base, while hopefully leading researchers to other otters in the area.

River otters are an alpha predator in the wetland system, and rely on the health and wellbeing of the entire system beneath them. By understanding their habits, researchers will be able to better identify where to restore various open land to benefit the health of otters and the biodiversity of all wildlife and humans.

voting, the newest member of Shedd Aquarium's marine mammal family, a male Pacific whitesided dolphin calf born on June 1st was named Makoa meaning 'fearless' in Hawaiian.

The six-month-old has nearly doubled in size since his birth and weighs a healthy 108 pounds, continues to achieve important milestones, such as bonding with mom Piquet and interacting with trainers and fellow dolphins.

For more than 20 years, Shedd Aquarium has participated in collaborative efforts that help the scientific community better under-stand the hearing, acoustics, social behavior, reproductive physiology and immune system of Pacific white-sided dolphins.

Found in the North Pacific Ocean, ranging from the South China Sea and Baja California Peninsula to the Sea of Okhotsk and the Bering Sea. Pacific these dolphins are distinguished by their black backs, gray sides and white bellies, as well as the black stripe that runs down on each side from above the eye to below the dorsal fin.
