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### Autism Is Often *Under-Diagnosed*



By Dr. R. Pletsch

A study conducted by utgers University recently released a study in the journal Autism Research that concluded that one fourth of students with Autism Spectrum Disorder go undiagnosed. Personally knowing the prevalence of Autism, I looked into the research. The study analyzed records of 266,000 8-year olds and found 4,550 met the diagnostic criteria for Autism and that 1,135 had not been diagnosed. The Center for Disease Control in 2018 stated 1 in 59 children were estimated to be on the spec-

The findings suggest Black and Latino students have a higher rate of not being diagnosed.
This can be partially explained by a lack of knowing the signs. All Autistic children do not have the same indicators. Some are severe and have

little communication skills. While others are like "The Good Doctor" on a TV series, but most are these

Autism is characterized by communications and social difficulties or deficits. They can display repetitive behaviors, or have fear of loud noises or bright situations. The authors state that professionals believe early diagnosis is crucial and suggest screening as early as 18 months. Because of recent research, it is easier for professionals to determine. There seems to be a stigma that being a developmental disorder, it means my child is "crazy". Therefore, like some other problems, people try to ignore them. But this will not make it better or disappear.

If you think there is a problem, seek help. I suggest Autism Speaks, an organization that helps families and supports research. They will have their annual Walk for Autism at Soldier Field on May 30th. They have dozens of booths sponsored by organizations that can give you an idea of what can be done or if anything needs to be

Teachers can be a help because, unlike Mom and Dad, they see many children daily and some for years and can be a good introduction to the help available through the school. Many people that do their research find wide range from severe to moderate and often find they are worried about nothing.




