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
## St. Bruno Society Hosts Party

## Giraffe Birth At Brookfield Zoo



Arnieta, a 5-year-old reticulated giraffe at Brookfield Zoo, gave birth to a male calf on Nov. 12th. They can be seen indoors in the zoo's Habitat Africa! The Savannah exhibit.

His birth marks three generations of giraffes at Brookfield Zoo, as Franny is Arnieta's mom. The sire, Hasani, 4, who arrived at Brookfield Zoo in 2010, is on a breeding loan from Lee Richardson Zoo in Garden City, Kansas.

Following a 14-1/2 month gestation period, mother giraffes give birth while standing, thus resulting in an approximately five-foot drop delivery for the calf. Within an hour after birth, the calf born at Brookfield Zoo was standing. When fully grown, he could reach 18 feet.

## **Now In Effect** This New Year, the

**Social Host Law** 

This New Year, the important role adults play in keeping alcohol out of the hands of children will be further defined, when new sanctions take effect on those allowing underage drinking in their home.

The new legislation closes a loophole of legal accountability on those who knowingly allow alcohol consumption by minors.

alcohol consumption by minors.

"By protecting our youth, we protect our future," says Illinois Governor Pat Quinn, who signed Public Act 97-1049 into law on Aug. 22nd, 2012. "Adults know it is unacceptable to allow underage drinking in their home.

in their home.

By putting a social host law on the books, we are sending a strong message that they will be held responsible when allowing this harmful activity."

activity."

Violators of the social host law, which takes effect will be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than \$500 when they knowingly authorize or permit underage drinking in their home.

If this activity results in great bodily harm or death to any person, the individual is subject to a Class 4 felony. However, a person will not be in violation if they have taken all reasonable steps to prevent this

activity.

No charges will be filed if assistance is required from law enforcement after discovery of the illegal activity.

## St. Rita Stock Club Wins Competition



The St. Rita Stock Club won first place in the Chicago fall 2012 stock market competition. The winning team members Victor Luna, Quentin Gray, Erik Landstrom, Collin Rook, Stanton Zaczek, Ian Leyden and Miguel Stein will be recognized during an awards reception at the Chicago Board Options Exchange on Jan. 16th. The 2012 competition ran from mid September through Dec. 14th. Each team starts with \$100,000 to invest in publicly traded companies or mutual funds through a computer simulation. The St. Rita team finished with \$110,445 which is a return of 10.4% during this period and equals an approximate annual return of 42%. Its top performing stock was Facebook which increased 35 percent. The stock club and moderator Mike Gallagher discussed investing basics from Peter Lynch who ran the Fidelity Magellan mutual fund and Warren Buffet who runs Berkshire Hathaway.

#### **Urge Flu Shots For Everyone**

The Illinois Department of Public Health, along with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is recommending everyone 6 months and older get a flu shot.

Every flu season is different and infection can affect people differently. Even healthy people can get very sick from the flu and spread it to others. During a regular flu season, about 90 percent of deaths occur in people 65 years and older.

Children ages months through 8 years need two doses of influenza vaccine (at least four weeks apart) during their first flu season.
