## Smartphone For Asthma Study

Researchers at Rush University Medical Center and The University of Illinois at Chicago are using the Internet and motivational multimedia coupled with positive reinforcement via a smartphone application to try to improve asthma outcomes among low-income, minority adolescents with asthma.

Each participant in the study receives a smartphone preloaded with an application that uses a reward system to encourage them to proactively take their daily asthma controller medications.

They also receive a free date plan (including unlimited talking, texting, email and internet) for the duration of their participation in the study.

Some asthma patients need to use daily controller medications to prevent asthma symptoms and attacks. Without the medication, a serious breathing problem can result due to inflammation in the airways. This may lead to missed school days or visits to the emergency room.

Dr. Marius Stan will present "The science of cinema and the cinema of science" at the McKinley Park Branch Library, 1915 W. 35th st., on Wednesday, July 10th at 6 p.m.

In addition to a good script, a director and actors, making a movie requires engineering and scientific methods in support of cinematography, sound and editing. A number of techniques initially developed for movie production are now being

used in scientific research.

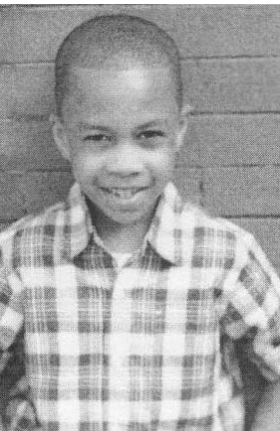

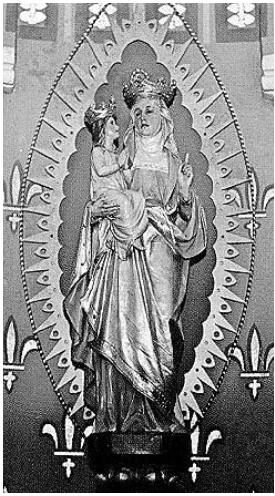

## Safety Crackdown For July 4-7
