



School Bells Bring Memories

Life is made of memories. This time of year we are drawn to remember the start of school. When I was growing up in The Back of the Yards, we had about 14 parochial schools within a half mile radius of our home. It seemed like most of them had different start dates so starting in the middle of August until after Labor Day someone was starting school. I'll mention a few of my memories and I hope it will bring back some good times to you.

I remember the year CPS changed its starting date to begin in August. But despite good efforts, attendance was very low. It does not show on the records, because you are not counted as absent until you actually attend one day. It soon went back to after Labor Day. Another year, a teacher strike had everyone confused especially when it was broadcast that if there was school or not, meals would be served. This was very confusing, teachers weren't there, but I was with hundreds of kids expecting to be fed and parents expecting all day baby sitting.

I had one young lady

come on opening day for 8th grade. I asked her why are you here, you graduated. The story goes she took off the last two weeks of school for vacation in Puerto Rico and someone told her if you go you won't graduate. Her family believed this. My worst day as a teacher I was substituting in a 7th grade class for CPS, we had no books, no supplies or air conditioning. The kids knew they would never see me again and it was a full day. As a principal, my first day with students at a new school, wasn't bad except for the opening teacher meeting when they started to tell me everything they wanted changed -- most of which I had no control over. I certainly learned never replace someone who had been there forever.

Back to home. A dear friend of mine went to Catholic school in the 50's was fearful for days before starting school because she knew she would have problems recognizing her teacher. See in those days, the habits were so full that you only saw the teacher's face, no hair, no ears. The little girl did not want to be embarrassed.

When it was the first day, I saw many kids and parents crying. The most unusual was the parent of a freshman. Later I found that due to WWII, her son was the first in the family to attend high school. My first day I went to kindergarten was my last in that grade. I followed my mother home. She said if you don't return, you can't wear those new clothes and I'll make you work at the table with me every day. I said it's a deal. I never returned and was ahead of my class in first grade. Lastly, upon retiring for the second time, people said you're going to miss it come September -- they were wrong.

High Reading & Math Scores For CPS

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot and Chicago Public Schools CEO Janice K. Jackson announced that a higher percentage of elementary CPS students are meeting or exceeding standards in reading and math than ever before.

Based on data from the Northwest Evaluation Association's Measures of Academic Progress 2018-19 assessment, which measures the academic achievement of students across the country, a majority of CPS students are not only showing strong performance, but also equaling or exceeding the growth of their peers nationwide.

During the 2018-19 school year, a record 61.8 percent of students met or exceeded the national average in reading, and a record 56.7 percent met or exceeded the national average in math.

NWEA data also show that eighth graders are building a strong academic foundation that prepares them for high

school, with 74.6 percent of eighth grade students meeting or exceeding the national attainment average in reading, and 64.5 percent in math.

Since 2013, the percentage of students meeting or exceeding national attainment averages has increased by over 16 percentage points in reading and nearly 12 percentage points in math.

In addition to outperforming national attainment averages in reading and math, CPS students also continue to exceed national growth averages. This year, 60.8 percent of students met or exceeded national growth averages in reading, and 56.2 percent of students met or exceeded national growth averages in math.

To continue to build upon these accomplishments, the district has committed to equitably expand the programs and resources that are helping students in every neighborhood succeed.

New Website For Interchange

The Illinois Department of Transportation announced the debut of www.JaneBryneInterchange.org, a new website for the Interchange reconstruction.

The website underwent an overhaul to improve navigation and enhance the visitor experience. Project information and updates are presented in a more initiative, user-friendly manner. The site is mobile-responsive, making project information accessible for a desktop, tablet or smartphone.

The original documentation from the planning phase of the project is archived in a new Document Library section.

Among the other highlights: latest timelines and updates on each of the project's 35 components, including an interactive project map. Photo galleries offering a glimpse of the project's progress as well as historic images. Information on Office of Business and Workforce Diversity resources. A livestream of the project site. Ability to submit questions and comments to the project team via a "Contact Us" link. Links to new dedicated accounts to receive the latest information through social media.

The reconstruction will improve safety and traffic flow of more than 400,000 motorists who use it daily, while enhancing mobility for bicycles, pedestrians and transit. Construction will be completed by 2022.

New Laws For Mortality Rates

State Senator Marin A. Sandoval (D-Chicago), a staunch advocate for women's health sponsored new laws to form a comprehensive plan to address rising maternal mortality rates- especially those among women and infants of color.

House Bill I creates the Task Force on Infant and Maternal Mortality among African Americans Act.

The second measure, House Bill 2897, requires

the Department of Public Health to investigate and apply for federal funding opportunities to support maternal mental health and requires the agency to file a report with the General Assembly regarding their efforts. House Bills 1 and 2897 were signed into law in July. House Bill 1 went into effect immediately and House Bill 2897 will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2020. Both measures passed the General Assembly with unanimous support.

Automatic Renewal For Sr. Exemption

Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi praised Illinois Governor JB Pritzker for signing Illinois House Bill 833 into law on Aug. 26th.

The bill amends the Illinois Property Tax Code so that a person who has been granted a Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption in Cook County will not need to reapply for the exemption every year.

Seniors not currently receiving the exemption, and those who turn 65 in 2019, must apply in 2020; their exemption will then automatically renew each year. Exemptions currently in place will renew automatically.

To prevent fraud in its application, the Cook County Assessor's Office is required to conduct an audit on every Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption at least once every three years.

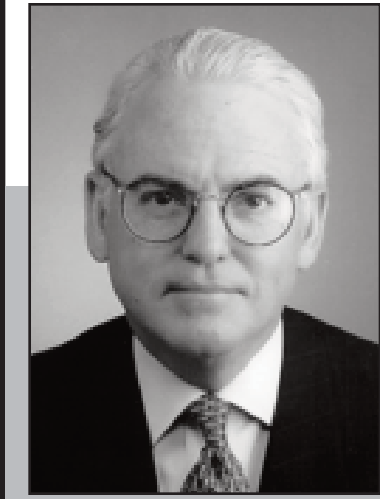
