

### Clif Notes By Clif Nagel, Contributing Editor

So you went out and bought your ride a nice set of wheels. They look great, but have considerably reduced your net worth. Your joy may be short lived if proper care is not followed.

Your wheels are exposed to much harsher conditions than, say, your paint or interior. In fact, if your interior is being exposed to harsh conditions, it's time to put the top up, or on, whichever the case may be.


During a casual drive, your wheels are subjected to hurricane-force winds propelling dirt, gravel, sticks, bits of asphalt, concrete, brake dust and rotor shavings, as well as the occasional squirrel or raccoon. There isn't much to do with steel wheels, except maybe paint them, but those nice rims with the multiple spokes in chrome or polished aluminum with intricate designs should be maintained to retain their out-of-the-box appearance for many years.

Most of the things you'll need for proper wheel care you probably already have. A hose or power washer, buckets, brushes (long and short handle), wheel cleaner, wheel woolies, clay bar, sealant or wax, terry cloth rags, microfiber towels, and a partridge in a pear tree.

You'll want to wash your wheels before the rest of the car. It would be good to check the wheel cleaner label to make certain it's compatible with the type of surface you're cleaning.

If in doubt, then good old soap and water will work fine. In fact this is the only instance where dishwashing detergent will work (Dawn). You can spray the wheel with your cleaner solution or wet your wheel down with the rags and wheel woolie (think a massive q-tip that can reach anywhere on the rim) and soap it up and rinse. Follow this by drying off with the terry cloth rag or towel and see where you missed. If you missed any spots, repeat the process until you're feeling all nice and fuzzy about the results.

If you can't get a smooth surface, then you might have to use the clay bar to clean the more stubborn areas. Remember, once you use the clay bar on the wheels, you can't reuse it on the car's paint. Embedded metal shavings captured by the clay will scratch your paint and ruin your day. Now that you have a clean wheel, next comes the fun part - shining and protecting.



Pay attention to your finishing product, as the products differ in relation to the surface you're protecting. Also the pads and applicators you use will matter. Apply your sealant or wax to the applicator, and treat the wheel like you would the painted surface.

Finally, scrubbing the sidewalls of the tires is necessary, and an application of some sort of tire gel. Choose the correct product for the look you prefer – thick and shiny, or matte with just a slight shine.

On September 26, 2021, I entered my 2002 Corvette to be judged by the Metro Long Island Chapter of the National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS) in Syosset. This was the first time my car qualified to be judged as to the age of the car. Cars from model year 2004 and later are currently deemed too new.

This was a great experience to watch the cars being judged, but I also met many new NCRS members who welcomed me to the meet and the organization. A point of interest is that one has to be a member of NCRS to have a car judged, so obviously I joined the club. The time spent on just the mechanical workings of the car was more then you could have imagined. The engine, the interior, the undercarriage, the A/C, the windows – the list goes on, including the glove box etc. The real thrill was watching the high-end mid years and the other older Corvettes being judged for hours.

The manuals were out and open, and the judges were under the cars with flashlights, meticulously inspecting and scoring every inch of the cars. I realized quickly that this is a whole different level of judging, as compared to our "shine and show" LICOA judged shows.

There were a number of Top Flight awards issued, and my car, which was in a Concourse Modified division, won top honors as a Modified Division 427 award. I saw some LICOA members judging, led by our own Mark Tulley.

I highly recommend anyone whose car qualifies for this type of judging and has an interest in having an organization like NCRS look at your car to do so, because to me it was quite an experience.

### Bitchin' Rides at Adirondack Nationals, 2021 Story and photos by Mike Lutz

My '79 Vette was accepted into the Lake George car show this year. Every year, this four-day car show takes place at Lake George during the weekend after Labor Day.

I drove my Vette for about two hours in the rain. When i got to Lake George, the car did not look from the ride, however, I cleaned it up and the rest of weekend was great. About 1,700 cars were in the show, all parked near Fort William Henry, overlooking Lake George.

On Friday and Saturday nights, they shut down Main Street, so cars could cruise through the town and around the Lake. Spectators lined up three rows deep to watch the cars and burnouts.
