I have had adults tell me the world is so dangerous. Well FBI stats say, based on population, that is not true. One problem is too much news on TV. They have all these channels that time must be filled. Now a child reports someone asked them into a car 50 miles away and they send the news crew. In the day, the family took a look and there was seldom even a police report

An unexpected consequence is in preventing bullying. Some are so hyper aware that they won't let it happen to their kid, so it teaches their kid is that they are being backed by a big person. When that happens you do not get bullied, but you can get away with it. I have had several students who were guarded by their

helicopter parents that became the bullies because they could pick someone who did not have someone backing them up. This is the same excuse we hear of many middle schoolers how they get involved in gangs. They want a big person to back them up.

While the stats cannot

be obtained except through anecdotal records, here are a few more unintended consequences. Father Andrew Greeley in a Sun-Times article some years ago wrote that he noticed the peace movement caused the Viet Nam war to last longer, because after they had large peace marches, the polls showed increased support for the war. Similar to this, is that when they have these anti-gun ral-lies gun sales go way up. A common reply from students is that my dad wanted to get the guns before they became illegal. Some stats say there are millions more guns than there were ten

years ago.


