

She went up to the calendar where Lincoln and Presidents Day and Washington's birthday were displayed and pointed to Feb. 11th, which is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The teacher had a little Blessed Mother in the

I asked my 6th grade class at Metcalfe Magnet which president do you think we should celebrate on President's Day?" The young man in the back of the class said "Ronald Reagan because he is the only president I heard of

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
