Go Run Chicago At 63rd St. Beach



New Development At 47th-Ashland

United Yards, a \$58M mixed-use project that will revitalize the Back of the Yards neighborhood is being developed by Celadon Blackwood Limited Partnership through the Mayor's INVEST South/West initiative. tiative. The project includes multiple new and rehabilitated commercial and residential buildings near 47th and Ashland.

The \$17.9M first phase includes the adaptive re-use of a former Goldblatt's at 4700 S. Ashland Ave. as a 15,000square-foot, federally qualified health center, which will provide primary care services. Approximately 7,200 square feet will be used as retail space for La Selva Apparel Company, Back of the Yards Coffee, Back of the Yards Barbershop, and Aracely's Bakery. 6,500- square-foot building at 1641 W. 47th st. will be anchored by Somos Monos Cerve-

Made possible by \$5M in Tax Increment Increment Financing by the Department of Planning and Development, the phase is expected to generate 40 permanent fulltime jobs.

The project's \$40M second phase includes a 51-unit affordable apartment building with a 7,000-square-foot technology training center for minority entrepreneurs at 1515 W. 47th St., and a pair of affordable threeflats at 4706-08 S. Marshfield Ave. All phase two residential units will be affordable for tenants earning up to 60% of the

area median income. The third phase will include the mixed-use rehabilitation of the three-story "Rainbow" three-story "Rainbow" commercial building at 4701 S. Ashland.

Sound Studios and Quartermaster Outpost Studio are seeking to redevelop a 571,000-square-foot warehouse within McKinley Park's Central Manufacturing District. With features ranging from movie studios to affordable housing, the projects were submitted in response to a July 2022 DPD RFP.

New Centers For Species Survival

The Species Survival Commission of the International Union for Conservation of Nature announces that Shedd Aquarium and The Morton Arboretum - have been named as Centers for Species Survival. These new designations elevate the role of the Chicago region as an international leader in biodiversity conservation. The aquarium and arboretum will have the opportunity to collaborate on conservation efforts, advancing projects that highlight the importance of aquatic and terrestrial linkages in Central American biodiversity

hotspots.
Shedd Aquarium has been designated as the first dedicated Center for Species Survival: Freshwater and The Morton Arboretum as the first Center for Species Survival: Trees. Only eleven Centers are recog-nized globally, five of which are in North America.

Centers for Species Survival are partnerships between leading conservation organizations and the IUCN SSC – a commission made up of more than 8,300 conservationists worldwide. Centers are hosted by leading zoo-logical and botanical conservation organizations that are engaged in work with key species or in specific geographical focus

The new Centers for Species Survival are being funded by the Walder Foundation, a private family foundation

based in Skokie, Illinois. Despite covering only about 0.8 percent of the Earth's surface, freshwater habitats support more than 10 percent of all known animals and about 50 percent of all fish species. A recent paper that Shedd contributed to described nine services that freshwater ecosystems provide - supporting food production, human health, water purification, climate regulation and more.

These same vital freshwater systems are most imperiled

ecosystems and face a growing list of challenges like pollution, habitat loss, overexploitation, fragmentation (e.g., dams and culverts) and the climate crisis.

Shedd's collaborative work will focus on critical watersheds in Central America, where aquatic wildlife populations are at risk of extinction. Leveraging the aquarium's existing portfolio of freshwater research, one attention area for the Shedd will be on freshwater mussels, that face the highest level of threat. The work will be expanded to include complementary surveying of freshwater fishes via a part-nership with the Field

Museum.
The State of the World's Trees Report, the first assessment of Earth's approximately 60,000 tree species, revealed that more than 17,500 are threatened with extinction. That is more than double the combined number of globally threatened mammals, birds, reptiles and amphibians.

The top dangers facing trees globally are climate change, land-use change for agriculture, logging, pests and diseases. These concerns require coordinated actions in collaboration with local community members, partners and stakeholders.

Work at the Arboretum's Center will elevate the importance of trees and plants while developing strategies and policies aimed at mitigating and reversing the global biodiversity crisis. The Center will also place a special emphasis on educating and inspiring the next generation of tree champions through outreach programs.

Chicago Reaches **E-Cig Settlement**

The City of Chicago announced that a \$23.8M settlement has been reached with JUUL Labs, leading e-cigarette maker, over claims that the company was engaged in harmful and deceptive business practices by marketing and selling vaping products to underage

According to the settlement, JUUL has agreed to pay the City \$2.8M within 30 days of the execution of the agreement. The City would receive an additional \$21M payment later this year under the current schedule and may potentially receive up to

\$750,000 additional, court-awarded payments. The case was handled by the Affirmative Litigation Division of the City's Law Department. Free Preparation For Income Tax

The Internal Revenue Service, American Association of Retired Persons' Foundation Tax-Aide Program, and Ladder Up Tax Assistance Program, provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to quali-fied individuals in select locations.
The IRS' Volunteer In-

come Tax Assistance and Tax Counseling for the Elderly programs offer free basic tax return preparation to qualified individuals needing assistance in preparing their own tax returns. People making \$60,000 or less, persons with disabilities limited Englishand speaking taxpayers can take advantage of this service

The TCE program offers free tax help, particularly for those who are 60 years of age and older, specializing in questions about pensions and retirement-related unique to seniors. VITA and TCE sites are generally located at community and neighborhood centers, libraries, schools, shopping malls, and other convenient locations. The AARP Foundation

Tax-Aide Program pro-

vides free tax assistance, with a special focus on taxpayers over the age of 50 or who have low-tomoderate income. Membership is not required to receive assistance.
The Ladder Up Tax Assistance Program provides free basic tax return

preparation for families earning up to \$60,000 and individuals earning up to \$32,000 annually. Taxpayers can search

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
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
