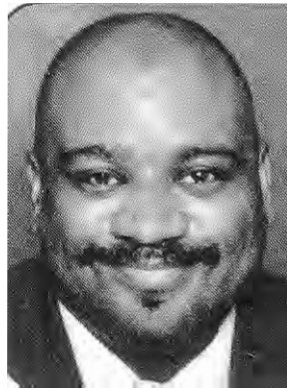

MWRD Promotes Water Monitoring

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago has joined the Water Environment Federation and International Water Association to encourage the public to monitor water quality.

Water quality monitoring is important to the MWRD because we want to ensure our resources and efforts have maximum impact on our area waterways," explained MWRD executive director David St. Pierre.

The MWRD has a continuous water quality monitoring program, and equipment distributed at 18 locations throughout the waterways takes hourly measurements of dissolved oxygen, acidity of pH, and conductivity. Data is downloaded into a database and used to assess water quality under various circumstances.

An ambient Water Quality Monitoring Program measures water quality at 59 stations on a monthly basis. Staff look at general chemistry, nutrients, algae, metals and more.

The MWRD also measures health of the waterways through biological sampling of living things like fish and bugs. For more information, visit www.MWRD.org.

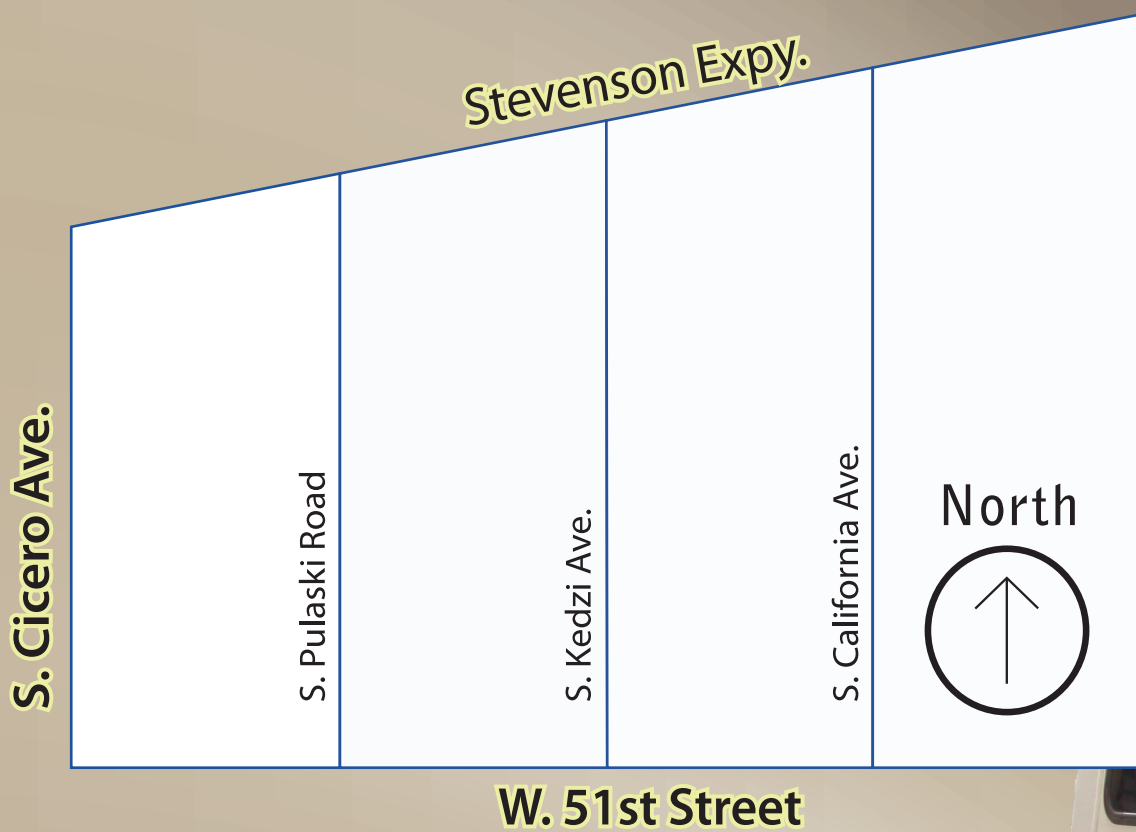

Enhanced Rules For Unemployment

The Illinois Department of Employment Security announced new federal rules for individuals receiving unemployment insurance benefits which require individuals to comply with measures to ensure that they are updating their jobs skills and looking for work. Those who do not comply risk losing their weekly unemployment insurance benefit payment.

In-person interviews with IDES staff will be required for workers transitioning from the state Regular Benefit program to the federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation program. Interviews also will be required for those transitioning from the first round of federal benefits to the second if they had not previously been interviewed. Those mandates are in addition to job-training services and interviews already re-quired. The interviews will ensure individuals are aware of skills assessment and job training programs designed to help them find work or identify a new career path. Individuals who do not participate or do not show examples of their work search will no longer be eligible for benefits.

Individuals will be mailed paperwork regarding skills assessment and work search history. This paperwork must be completed and brought to the interview.

There are six programs in Illinois: Regular Benefits, Emergency Unemployment Compensation, Tiers I, II, III and IV and Extended Benefits. In February, Congress extended the EUC programs through the end of 2012. EB, which was set to expire March 10th, also was extended. When EB ends in Illinois depends on how swiftly the state unemployment rate declines. Up to 99 weeks of unemployment insurance benefits remain potentially available for claimants.
