Dyslexia is a term we hear in dealing with children. But one of the problems is people think they know what it means and, in general, we do not. Jay Leno announced he was dyslexic many times on his TV show. This has its good points as well as bad points. On the good side, it brought about some awareness of the issue. On the bad side, many people would say it cannot be that bad if Jay Leno still became a multimillionaire while dealing with it.



terns within the brain while they are reading". This is one of those things that parents must realize if your child has this diagnosis, that is an issue to deal with, not to be embarrassed by.

Ask someone on the street what dyslexia means and they often say that when we see "was" they see "saw" or we see "James: and they see "Semaj". This is an issue that some deal with it, but not all. For some it is only certain letters, some see the letters upside down, some see one word differently in a sentence, others see every word in a sentence. You can see it is quite varied. Steinke urges teachers and parents to help raise awareness. She and I recom-mend "Overcoming Dyslexia" by Sally Shaywitz. She and her partners from Yale are dealing with different learning tools for children.

I wish this was available to guide me when as a young teacher, counselors told me "don't worry about it, she's dyslexic". Times have changed and so have I.

Gifted to the City in the early 20th century by the Daughters of the American Revolution, the 30- by 50-inch brass plaques honor the location of the Sauganash Hotel where Chicago was incorporated as a town and, later, the Wigwam convention hall, on the southeast corner of Wacker Drive and Lake

st. The wood-framed Sauganash Hotel was built in 1831 by pioneer Mark Beaubien as an addition to his log cabin. The white, two-story hotel served as the social center of the growing town and hosted monthly village board meetings from 1833 to 1835. Named for the Potawatomi-British fur trader Sauganash, also known as Billy Caldwell, the hotel remained in operation, including an 1837 stint as the city's first theater, until it burned down in 1851.

Nine years later, the Wigwam was erected on the same location for the 1860 Republican National Convention. Designed by Chicago
