

## Maintaining Libraries

Now, do not even think of religion in the library, or you may be part of a law suit. Many public libraries are shortening their hours and purchasing less new books. As this is all a tax weapon using social media as an excuse. Fewer people are borrowing books and only coming in to use computers.

I recently met several young teachers from different districts in California. They were here for a meeting and professional development. They have a good cross-section politically. Some were left, some were center and some were right. One of the things they agreed on was that their schools are using less funds for books in their libraries as the funds seem to be going

toward technology. The sad truth is that technology has a short usable time that schools must purchase license for. Do not believe that because it's on the internet schools get everything for free. Many schools seem to have rooms full of old programs, old computers and, of course, they must hire a technology specialist to try and keep the programs up and running.

The ones this lack of books really affects are those in the lower financial group because they cannot browse the shelves of the various genre of books. Those with higher income parents have the higher end computers at home and know the internet is great for research, but this is seldom true in younger students.

It is true that in many elementary schools the librarians are used to supply mandated prep periods to the teachers. It is true that some of these librarians let the children browse and borrow books from the school library. It is not easy in their limited time but at the elementary level many schools are successful at this.

Those of you on PTAs and LSCs try to help your libraries receive some funds for new books every year. It can actually be cost effective because even though the price of books has gone up tremendously, they can last for many years. Some of the money that is being diverted to technology, while it impresses some people, does not have a long shelf-life.

## Anniversary Of U-505 Capture

The Museum of Science and Industry Chicago, 57th and Lake Shore drive is commemorating the 75th anniversary of the U-505 submarine's capture with a special exhibit featuring rarely seen photographs and artifacts along with free on-board tours on Tuesday, June 4th, the capture date. The event will showcase the newly completed two-year conservation work in key areas of the sub.

The U-505 is the first vessel captured by the U.S. Navy since the War of 1812, and its seizure, just two days before D-Day, was critical in helping the Allies understand German technology and codes. The 252-foot vessel was captured by the U.S.S. Guadalcanal Task Force 22.3, led by Navy Captain Daniel Gallery, a Chicago native.

The U-505 is the only U-boat of its kind (type IX-C) in the United States and one of only four left in the world. MSI will unveil U505 Submarine: 75 Stories, a year-long exhibit built from vast collection and archives.

Guests will see the personal journals and belongings of German and American sailors, photos taken during the war and pop culture items including a board game and comic book celebrating the actions of Captain Daniel Gallery.

Thanks to a grant from the National Maritime Heritage Grant Program, the Museum was able to embark on a nearly two-year conservation project focused on preservation and restoration of key areas of the submarine.

The sub, a National Historic Landmark, became part of the Museum's permanent collection in 1954 with the help of Daniel Gallery, a Chicago native and captain of the task force that captured the sub. Docked outside of the Museum for nearly 50 years, the boat debuted inside a 35,000 square foot exhibit in 2004 featuring multiple interactive units, nearly 200 artifacts, re-enactments of key events and testimonials from Task Group 22.3 veterans who made the capture.

U-505 Submarine: 75 Stories runs through May 2020 and the U-505 exhibit is a permanent experience. Both exhibits are included with Museum entry, which is free to Illinois residents June 3rd to 5th. Guests can reserve timed-entry tickets for On-Board Tours at msichicago.org and onsite in the Entry Hall. On-board tours will only be free of charge on June 4th and are subject to capacity limits. Tickets are distributed on a first come, first served basis.

## Skender Creates Modular Housing

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot joined Skender CEO Mark Skender and community and business leaders for the ribbon cutting of a new manufacturing facility at 3348 S. Pulaski. The Chicago-based construction, design and manufacturing firm will develop steel modular housing units from technical design to onsite completion, expanding affordable housing options.

The new manufacturing facility will create 150 full-time jobs once operations reach full capacity. Steel-frame three-flats will be developed in nine weeks, which is faster and more cost-effective than traditional methods of subsidized affordable housing construction. In the first year up to 200 affordable housing units will be produced through a mix of three-flats, six-flats and mid-rises.

## CPS Releases Charter Budgets

Following a year-long process to establish a revised charter school funding approach that provides equitable resources in line with district-run schools, Chicago Public Schools released charter school budgets for the 2019-20 school year.

This follows the March 2019 release of district school budgets, which include an additional \$55 million for district-run schools to support the expansion of academic programming, expansion of free, full-day Pre-K for four-year-olds in 28 additional communities, and \$31 million in equity grants for high-needs schools.

A revised funding model became necessary following state education funding reform in 2017, which in addition to providing the district with new revenue also required Illinois school districts to fund charter

schools based on district spending from two years prior and at a narrow per-student funding range.

CPS, the Illinois Network of Charter Schools and nearly all Chicago charter operators have agreed to a revised funding approach that will return to a Student Based Budgeting funding model aligned to current funding rates for district schools.

The revised approach is codified in a resolution passed by the Chicago Board of Education at its April 2019 meeting. Through this approach, charter schools will receive SBB funding aligned to the 2.5 percent increase provided to district-run schools, for a total year-over-year funding increase of \$19 million, which is in alignment with the funding increase district-run schools received.

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## 1st Report of West Nile Virus

The Illinois Department of Public Health has confirmed the first mosquitoes to test positive for West Nile virus for 2019. DuPage County Health Department staff collected the positive mosquitoes on May 21st in Wayne, Illinois. No human cases have been reported so far this year.

“The recent rains are leaving many pools of water behind, not only in sewer systems under streets and drainage ditches along roads, but in our own backyards,” said Acting IDPH Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike. “As we start to see higher temperatures, we will start to see more virus activity. It’s easy to take precautions to protect yourself by wearing insect repellent and getting rid of standing water around your home.”

Monitoring for West

Nile Virus includes laboratory tests for mosquito batches, dead crows, blue jays, robins and other perching birds, as well as testing sick horses and humans with West Nile virus - like symptoms.

The virus is transmitted through the bite of a *Culex pipiens* mosquito, commonly called a house mosquito, that has picked up the virus by feeding on an infected bird. Symptoms include fever, nausea, headache and muscle aches.

However, four out of five people infected with West Nile virus will not show any symptoms. In rare cases, severe illness including meningitis, encephalitis, or even death, can occur. People older than 60 and individuals with weakened immune systems are at higher risk for severe illness.

### Assessor Kaegi Supports HB 833

Cook County Assessor Kritz Kaegi reiterated his support for HB 833, a bill that requires the automatic renewal of the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption. The bill's chief sponsor is Assistance Majority Leader Fred Crespo.

HB833, which unanimously passed out of the House Revenue Committee, would amend the Property Tax Code so that a person who has been granted a Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption would not need to reapply for the exemption every year.

To allow for the automatic renewal and prevent fraud, the Illinois Dept. of Public Health would be required to send the Cook County Assessor's Office death record information quarterly while the CCAO would access the Social Security Administration's Master Death List and exchange information with the Recorder of Deeds office on transactions of properties with a Senior Homestead Exemption.

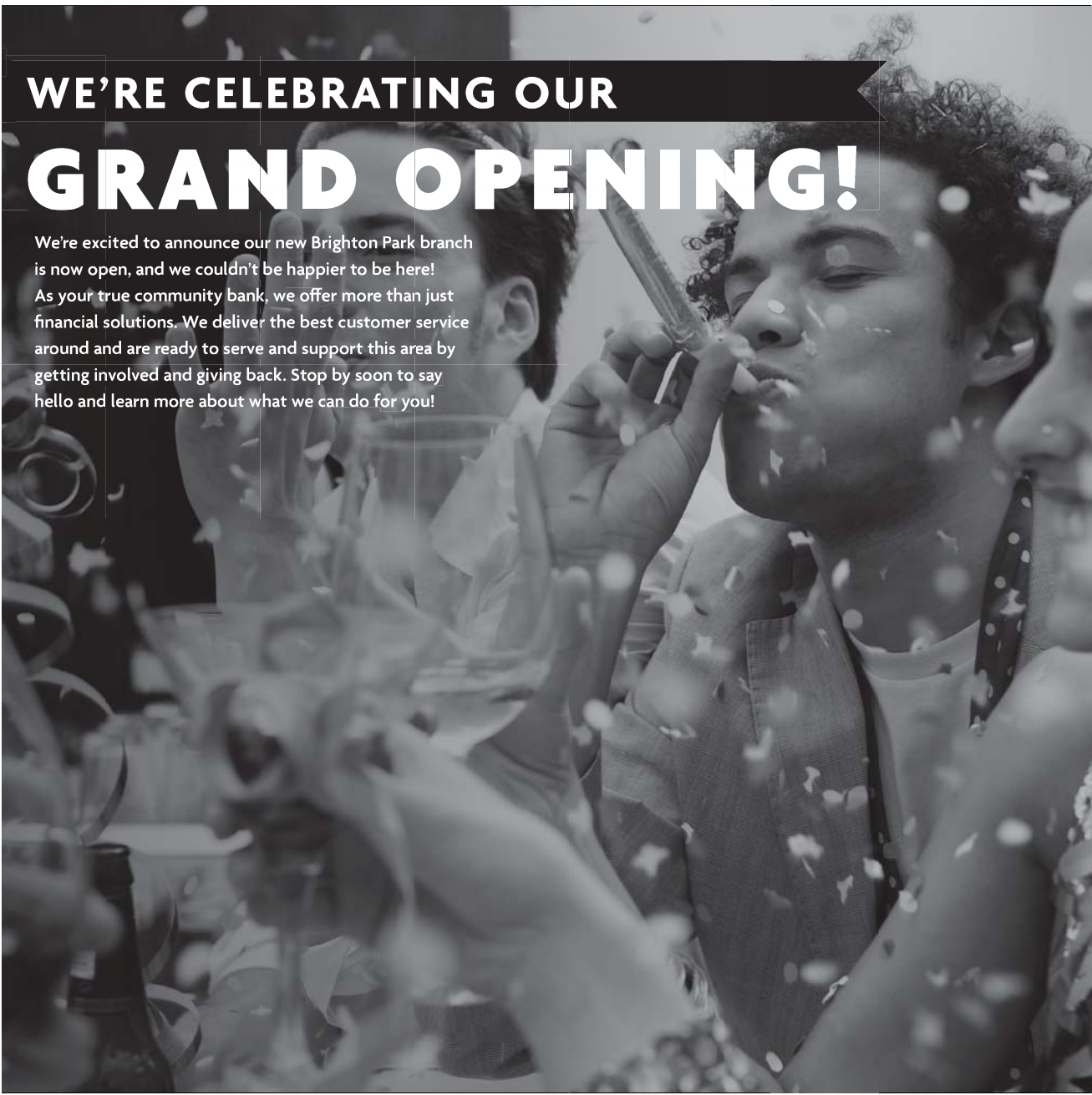
