

## World Youth Day

The Catholic Church has just sponsored World Youth Day in Panama and an estimated 400,000 attended these four days of celebrating prayer, music and culture. Pope Francis attended many of the activities and celebrated Mass. He helped use his influence to encourage the youth (16 - 35) to rekindle their flame for worship. He also visited a youth prison trying to show care for all -- after all we The event came to this equatorial country during their traditional Christmas break. However, the United States and Canada work on a different schedule which made it hard for high school and college kids to attend. The two-year notice given since the last World Youth Day in Krakow did provide time for the youth from about 150 countries to attend.

Central America is not the Catholic area it once was. Like many cultures, organized religion is not as vibrant as it once was. It is estimated that only about 75% of the population in this area follows Catholicism. The US Embassy made suggestions available for all those attending the program. It included lists of legal, medical, and security concerns.

The Chinese have since spread their influence in the area, both militarily and economically as many central American countries have large debts because of loans by the Chinese. This would be an interesting research project for high school kids.

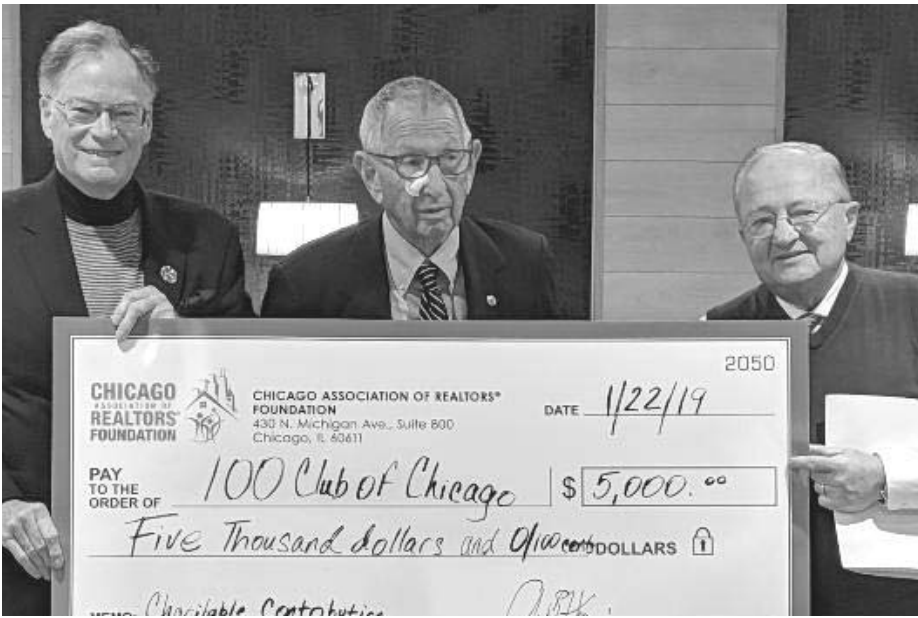

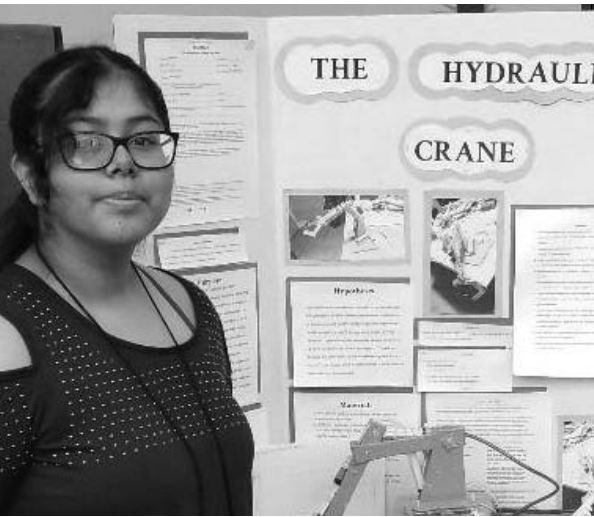

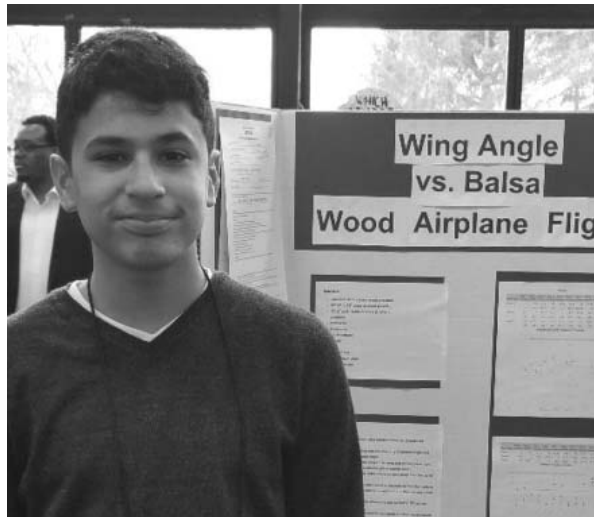

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## Applications For Energy Assistance

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity announced that income qualified households can apply for winter heating assistance through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

If your last thirty day income has been affected by the federal shutdown, if you lost your job, if you are a student living away from home struggling to pay your utility bills, LIHEAP can help. A single-person household can qualify with a monthly gross income of up to \$1,518; a two-person household up to \$2,058; a family of three up to \$2,598; and a family of four up to \$3,138. Benefits are paid to energy vendors on behalf of eligible households. The exception is households whose heating costs are included in their rent.

LIHEAP applications are processed through a network of 35 local administering agencies. Customers must bring all required documentation when applying for assistance, including: Proof of gross income from all household members for the 30-day income period beginning with the date of the application. A copy of their current heat and electric bills issued within the last 30 days (if they pay for their energy directly). A copy of their rental agreement (if they are renting) showing that utilities are included, the monthly rental amount and landlord contact information. Proof of Social

Security numbers for all household members. Proof that their household received TANF or other benefits, such as Medical Eligibility or SNAP, if receiving assistance from the Illinois Department of Human Services.

Reconnection Assistance is available for households who are disconnected from their energy source needed for heating or are under imminent threat of disconnection.

Furnace Assistance is available for households who qualify for LIHEAP, have an inoperable heating system, and are in need of furnace repair or replacement.

LIHEAP heating assistance applications, including Reconnection Assistance, will continue to be accepted through May 31st or until funding is exhausted. Furnace Assistance applications are accepted through March 31st or until funding is exhausted.
