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### Charter No Help To Charter Schools

The school year is in full swing. Friendships are being renewed, seniors once again are enjoying quiet days and young moms are crying. But of course this is Chicago and all is not worry-free. Among the worries is CPS funding.

Suburban flight continues to decimate Chicago's population and its tax base. It has also become more of a problem trying to find a Catholic school, which because of fewer teaching Sisters and a leak of ing Sisters and a lack of former ethnic commitment the Archdiocese of Chicago has fewer students since any records I can find since before WWII. Several of the schools that consider themselves Catholic have few, if any, Catholic students.

The issue we have been hearing about recently is the expansion of Charter schools. Causing the local CPS schools to lose funds to them, but let me bring up another issue, that is that the existing Charter schools should be in the campaign to limit more charters -- they are competing for the same kids.






