mentary film concerns Lithuanian resistance to the Soviet occupation from the signing of the Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact in 1939 to the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991.

Filmmaker David O'Rourke will introduce the film and discuss the reasons which compelled him and his project part-ner Ken Gumbert to make it.

The film features interviews with Lithuanian deportation survivors, many of whom were only children when they were

deported. Their retelling of horrific events, the round up and separation from family, horrific conditions on crowded Siberia-bound cattle cars, starvation and grueling living and work condi-tions in Gulag prisons and camps is revealed in moving detail.



Ward Blitz For Graffiti Removal



Graffiti - removal crews are now using a new method of "blitzing" neighborhoods using a ward-based grid system to improve efficiency and increase productivity. The same method used by tree-trimming and removal crews has reduced a backlog or open requests for service by more than 25 percent over the past 3 months. 
