Circuit Court Schedules Tour

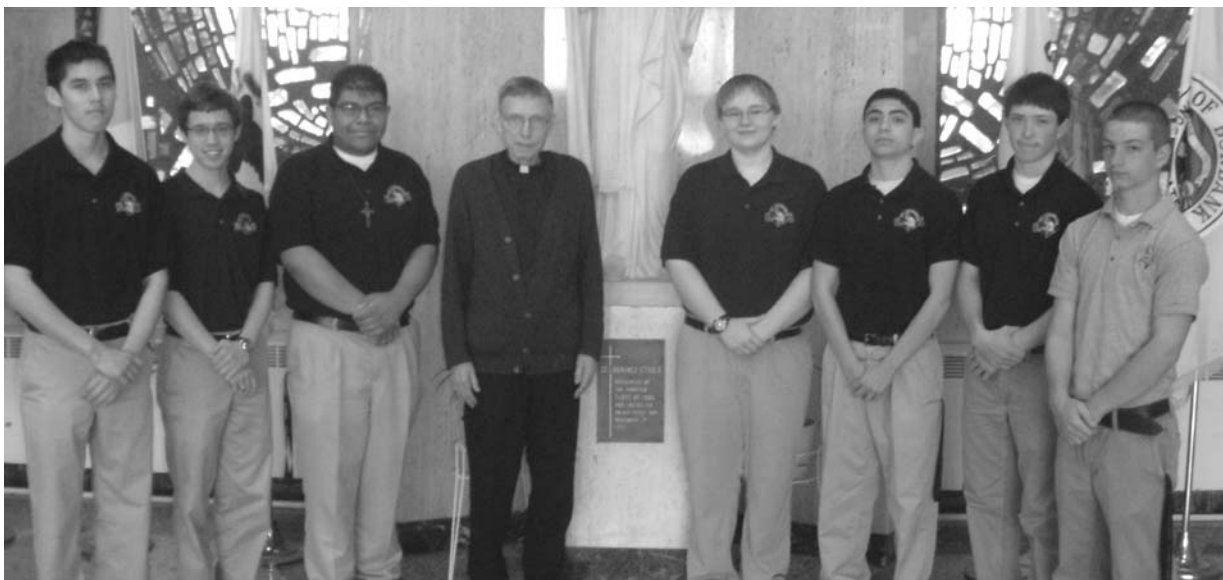

Students will be singing his favorite song "Lord, When You Came to the Seashore" in English and Spanish, participate in presenting the Offertory Gifts, reading Prayers of the Faithful and walk in the procession from the church to an outdoor altar.

A ceremonial blessing

and planting of an oak tree will take place in the parish courtyard to honor the memory of Pope John Paul II.

The late Pope holds a special place in the hearts of Five Holy Martyrs Parish, as well as the Brighton Park community, when he celebrated Mass on Oct. 5th, 1979 in the parish parking lot.

The Mass was attended by hundreds of thousands of people who crowded the lot and the streets before dawn just to catch a glimpse of the Holy Father and be a part of this historic day.

The main part of this altar still remains and a Mass commemorating the anniversary of His visit is celebrated every year on the first Sunday of October.

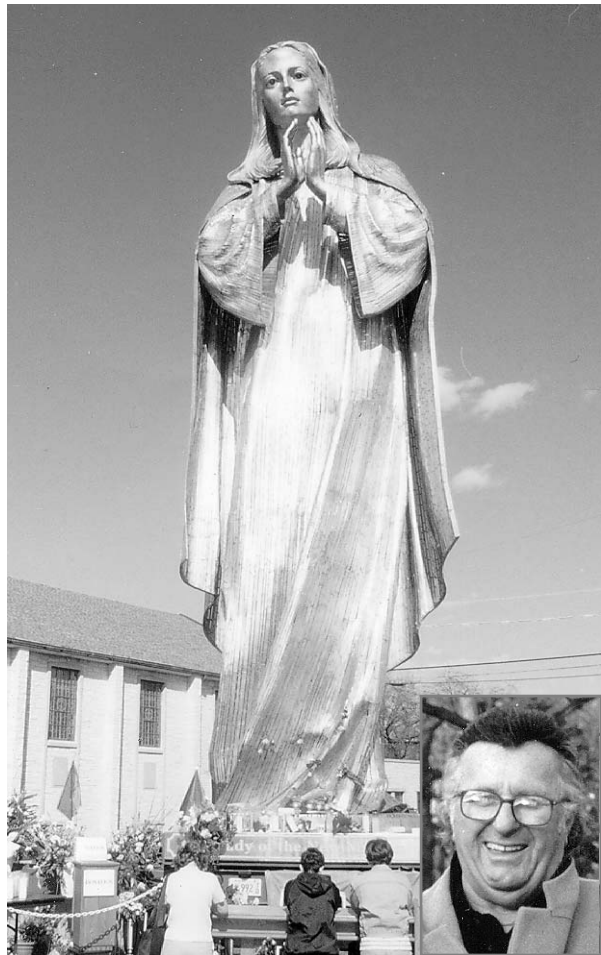

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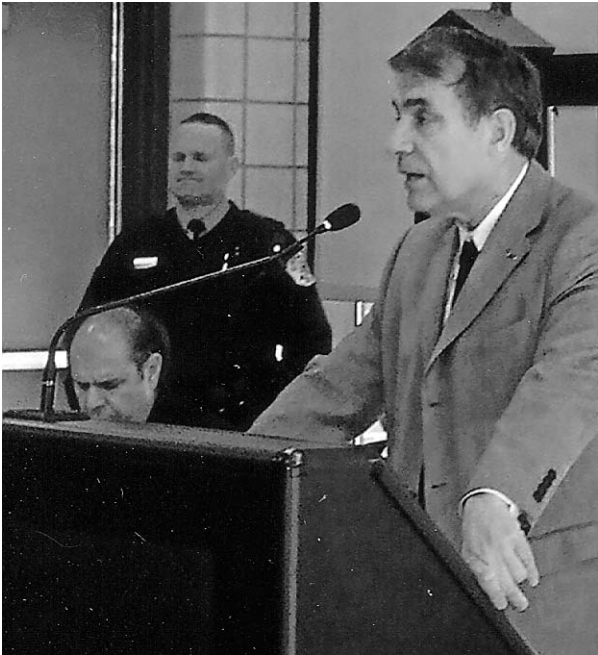
