Blessed be the Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit – the one God who writes the law on our hearts, who draws all people together through Jesus. **Amen.**


CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

FIRST READING: Numbers 21:4-9




COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION Please SIT






