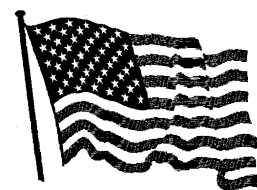

Central Park Post Remembers Wilkowski

In 2013, Central Park Post 1028, The American Legion embarked on a patriotism awareness program. Many of its 20 World War II veterans have since been featured in profiles of their wartime experiences.

Post historian and publicist Kenny McClory said, "There is no better way to say thanks then by remembering these brave vets who fought to protect our countries freedom."

Nine WWII vets remain active Post members and five still participate in its honor guard ritual team.

Frank Wilkowski was born in Bridgeport and inducted into the U.S. Army on Oct. 16th, 1941. He was assigned to the 107th Cavalry Reconnaissance Unit which boasted 29 battle streamers. Their mission was to penetrate enemy lines, collect intelligence, interrogate prisoners and relay information to assist with combat strategy.

In January, Wilk and the 107th were shipped to France and engaged in operation Norwind during the Siegfried Line Campaign. By March,

they assisted in the capture of the Ramagen Bridge crossed the Rhine River on March 25th. On April 1st, allied forces surrounded 300,000 German troops in Ruhr, and by April 18th, the last of the German Troops surrendered. On May 7th, the unconditional surrender ended the war in Europe. May 8th through June 29th the 107th engaged in area security in Fussen, Bavaria and home to the Dachau Concentration Camp.

On Aug.. 11th, Wilk's unit was assigned to the Pacific Theatre, but the troop ship was recalled. Japan formerly surrendered aboard the U.S. Battleship Missouri on Sept. 2nd, 1945 to end the most devastating war in history.

During 8 months of intense combat, Frank Wilkowski was awarded 3 bronze stars, WWII victory medal, overseas service bar, American defense ribbon, European theatre ribbon, European - African - Middle Eastern theatre ribbon and good conduct medal.

On Nov. 6th, 1945 Tech 4 Wilkowski was honorably discharged. This past April, he passed away. On April 26th, son Rick Wilkowski received his father's final military award, the Post Everlasting during the honor guard ritual team ceremony.

At the end of World War II, General George S. Patton stated, "It is foolish and wrong to mourn the men who died. Rather we should thank God that such men lived."

New Charter, No Surprise

A new charter high school is coming to the 47th and California area. The papers have been full of the arguments for and against this new high school for months. The location is only a half mile from Kelly High School and less than a mile from the new Back of the Yards High School. The proponents argue that the school is needed because of overcrowding and to give parents choice. Those against the new school had figures showing these schools were not overcrowded and that the literature provided showed no difference between the curriculum in the charter school and that of the local high schools.

Several Seniors have asked me what is going on. Why are we paying for more seats and a new building when we can't afford the ones we have. These Seniors are very worried about their taxes and most of them never attended a public school, nor sent their kids to one. Remember when our communities had real choice, like St. Barbara High School, St. Mary of

Perpetual Help High School, St. Joseph High School, Maria High School, Little Flower and Luther South. All of these were filled with students from our communities.

The charter system has no real accountability. If they are voted down at CPS, they go over their head to the State Charter Board, which can overrule the Board of Ed -- so basically Aldermen can say what they want, they have no vote. It's your State Rep. and State Senator who have the ability to vote for new charter school laws. This reminds me of Mel Gibson in "The Patriot" when looking at a battlefield stated "This battle was over before it started." The charter system does their homework before they even apply. That's the 21st Century. It is unlike the people who live in the past that think filling a meeting room and marching down the street making noise can beat the system. There is no accountability with appointed boards, but people who can make these boards elected pick the members. Just like term limits. It's the one who would lose security that must vote for it. Contemplate this, the city is broke, the county is broke, the state is broke, the federal government is broke. What do you see as a common thread?
