"Faith & Marriage" (part 1)

Sermon Series: Malachi: Return to the Lord Main Passage: Malachi 2:10-15

Opened with a discussion about how the **Bible** has made me love history even more than I already did.

- King <u>Solomon</u> was given great wisdom and blessed beyond measure, but he eventually fail because his **wives** caused him to worship other gods. (ref:1 Kings 3:11-14, 11:4-8)
- There should be no part of a Believer's <u>life</u> that Jesus is not Lord over. "He is either Lord of all, or not Lord at all."
- Our Government does have authority, and we are commanded to recognize it and honor those over us, but their authority stops the moment it contradicts God's **word**.
- God's condemning of interfaith <u>marriages</u> has nothing to do with race, culture, or nationality, but has everything to do with one having faith in Jesus alone!
- Believers are not supposed to marry unbelievers. (ref: Deut. 7:3-4; 2 Cor. 6:14)
- 1) Marriages to an unbeliever shows a lack of faith in regard to their **faith** family.
 - When we study the rebuke of <u>interfaith</u> marriages and the consequences, it is clear that this sin not only affects the Body/Church/Faith Family but causes the removal from it as well. (vs 10-12)
 - Believers are not on this journey alone, and our <u>sins</u> do affect those around us. We can and sometimes do cause others to stumble.
 - Marriage to an <u>unbeliever</u> isn't impossible, but it is very difficult. This difficulty will have an effect on those who care and minister to you.
- 2) Marriage to unbeliever shows a lack of faith in regard to **God**.
 - Verse 11 makes it clear that it is an "abomination" to Him, and "profanes" His sanctuary.
 - The New Testament is clear that our **bodies** are now the Temple of God, and when we use our bodies in sin we are bringing our sin into His **Temple**. (ref: 2Cor. 6:14-16; 1Cor. 6:18-20)
 - One of the main reasons God wants us married to believers is so that our **children** that will worship Him. (vs 15)
