- In 1967, Hermosa Beach, CA, formed a "sister city" relationship with the city of Loreto, in Baja California Sur, Mexico, and thus was formed the Hermosa Beach Sister City Association (HBSCA).
- This serene, picturesque fishing village is located on Sea of Cortez in the southern part of the Baja California peninsula.
- Over the years, the HBSCA has forged a very close bond with Loreto and its citizens.
- The HBSCA is a United States Congressionally Recognized Program.





Projects



- K-1st Grades Make "All About" books with topics like "Me," "My Family," My House," "What I like to Do," etc...
- 2nd-3rd Grades Learn how to write personal and business letters and write letters to friends in Loreto, stores, government officials, etc. Start with templates and then get creative and make your own...
- 4th-5th Grades Research a topic like local history, the environment, government, the Baja CA Missions, etc. and make a PowerPoint presentation
- 6th-8th Grades Create a multi-media presentation using PowerPoint, Prezi, Explain Everything, or another media program to Teach a Lesson. Maybe a "How to" or an English as a 2nd Language or a Spanish Lesson.
- Any Grade Create art using any medium (scenes depicting the beach, pier, walk streets, businesses, weather, people, parks, families, friends, etc.
