The past five years have shown Claremont's Forensic Society to be an ever-expanding organization with a rapidly growing reputation throughout the country. About forty debaters participated in over two hundred contests, accumulating an enviable win-loss record. This year's twenty tournament schedule witnessed the inclusion of the University of Arizona's Desert Invitational Tournament and a tour of the East by Claremont's team of Perry Lerner and Jim Bruen—a tour that included debates at Harvard, Columbia, and at Dartmouth's stiffly competitive Invitational Tournament.

Significant victories of the first semester included winning the 2nd place sweepstakes award at the L.A. State Tournament. Two teams, Duane Quaine-Joe Dauben and Aaron Fuller-Steve Wright, tied for 1st place in lower division debate, Fuller won 3rd place in Extemp., plus the rest of the squad obtained the sweepstakes award. Later the C.M.C. squad travelled to Fresno to capture first place in the Northern California Team Championship plus the Outstanding Speaker award.
