Bower 1940.*" Frederick Orpen Bower (1855-1948) was a British botanist, lecturer and author who wrote a number of books on botany including a three volume work on ferns. He was a Fellow of the Royal Society, the Royal Society of Edinburgh and several other scientific societies. The first half of this work is an account of the author's life and the history of reform in scientific education following the publication of Darwin's works. The author includes biographical information about the main figures of the age including von Sachs, Thiselton-Dyer, Balfour, Bentham and J. D. Hooker. VG. \$60.00



3. **Brown Brothers, Continental Nurseries** - *TREES & PLANTS FOR THE WORLD OUT OF DOORS*. Rochester, NY circa 1910. Color chromolithograph plate book including a total of 100 full-page chromolithographs (printed recto and verso) each showing fruits, vegetables, ornamental trees and flowers. About half of the catalogue is devoted to fruit and ornamental trees; the rest features flowers. The lovely plates were based on watercolors by Alois Lunzer, who collaborated with Thomas Meehan, botanist and author, and Louis Prang, publisher, in producing *The Native Flowers and Ferns of the United States* (1879). Bound in before the first page is a (2)pp. printed listing of all of the illustrations including a brief descriptive note for each plant plus prices for which the illustrations could be purchased as individual plates. The entire issue of Vol. 40 Part 3 is present and paginated: pp.361-648, clxxii-clxxvi (Extracts from the *Proceedings* of the Royal Horticultural Society), 52-advertisements. This issue also includes E. A. Bowles' "Some Good Books for an Amateur Gardener's Library," pp.401-413. Laid in is a 4pp. Contents for the entire Volume 40 (which was published in three parts, the present issue being Part 3).

Wraps quite worn, much of spine chipped, 2" piece from rear wrap gone, leaves lightly yellowed. Fair copy of a work scarce in its originally published form. \$30.00

A number of b&w illustrations showing notable figures in the history of the California fruit trade as well as photos of trees, fruits, and buildings. 38pp. Wraps. Large 8vo. Sacramento, CA 1938. California Fruit Exchange.

Includes nine articles by Butterfield on the history of various fruits (pear, cherry, plum, peach, apple, fig, grape, apricot, and persimmon). Scarce. VG. \$35.00

**Vol. 3 Part 4** – “Third Supplement” by George Goodwin, Jr.. pp.165-174. 1957.

**Vol. 4 Part 1** – “Fourth Supplement” by G. H. Goodwin, W. T. Stearn and A. C. Townsend. pp.1-19. 1962.

Bound together in library buckram with George H. M. Lawrence's bookplate. Lawrence (1910-1978) helped establish the Hunt Botanical Library and the Liberty Hyde Bailey Hortorium. London 1936-1957. Published by the Society for the Bibliography of Natural History.

Provides references for determining the dates of publication for natural history books and serials. Each paper is arranged alphabetically by the name of the author of the natural history book under discussion, not by the author of the reference. It was meant to address the “problems of nomenclature and of citation in precise chronological sequence.”

A fifth supplement to be included in Vol.5 Part 1 is discussed, but we do not know if it was ever published. OCLC lists only the original paper and Supplements 1-2. VG.

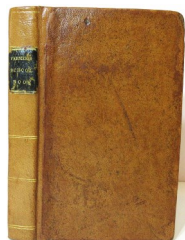

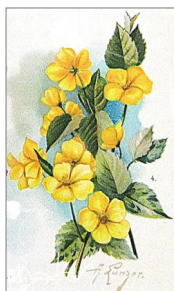
