

Travel and Behavior Guidelines During the Tour

- 1) Be respectful of others' opinions, privacy, space and any physical limitations. In addition, be respectful of the customs, culture, religion and lifestyle of the people of Morocco.
- 2) Notify the tour leader or driver immediately if you are ill, have an emergency or have some other issue that has arisen which affects your ability to participate in or enjoy the activities of the tour.
- 3) There will be no tolerance on the tour for insulting, belittling, bullying or shaming behavior toward any other traveler on the tour. If such behavior occurs, you could be asked to leave the tour without any refund for the remaining portion of the tour you would not be allowed to enjoy.
- 4) Do not discuss potentially emotional-charged topics like political issues or religion, or make any derogatory comments about politicians or religious leaders so we can all enjoy the tour without feeling attacked, judged or alienated.
- 5) Notify the tour leader if you plan to go out and explore on your own. This is just a precaution, in case you are not accounted for we will have some information.
- 6) Do not photograph or video policemen, military members, Royal Guard or any government official without permission, with the exception of the Royal Guards at the Mausoleum in Rabat.
- 7) Do not take photographs or video of military installations, airports, train stations, or prisons.
- 8) Do not bring in, purchase or use any marijuana or THC derivative prescription medications, supplements or any over-the-counter medications or products.
- 9) Do not bring into Morocco, or attempt to purchase, purchase, or use any illegal drugs.
- 10) Do not share fellow travelers' names or photographs on social media without their permission.

11) Do not wear revealing clothes. Morocco is a conservative country so items such as backless shirts; plunging necklines; mini skirts; short shorts; see-through skirts, dresses or shirts; thong or any other very skimpy bathing suit would be considered inappropriate.

12) Do not invite anyone you meet while in Morocco to visit or stay the night at any of our accommodations, to join any of our activities, meals or travel. Riads and hotels are required to document who is in each room. The accommodation could be fined heavily and it could affect all the other travelers on the tour.

13) No smoking is allowed in the tour vehicle, in the hotels or riads unless smoking rooms are available and you have requested a smoking room before arriving in Morocco. There is also no smoking allowed during any group activities or within 50 feet of the group.

14) Be on time when we are scheduled to have an activity or depart the riad/hotel.

15) Be able to be flexible. While every attempt will be made to address concerns or physical needs be aware that sometimes those needs may not be able to be met. For example, if you are cold in the car because of the A/C but most passengers want the A/C on, have a sweater or jacket.

16) Be familiar with what items/products are not allowed to be brought back into the U.S. to avoid any issues upon return.
