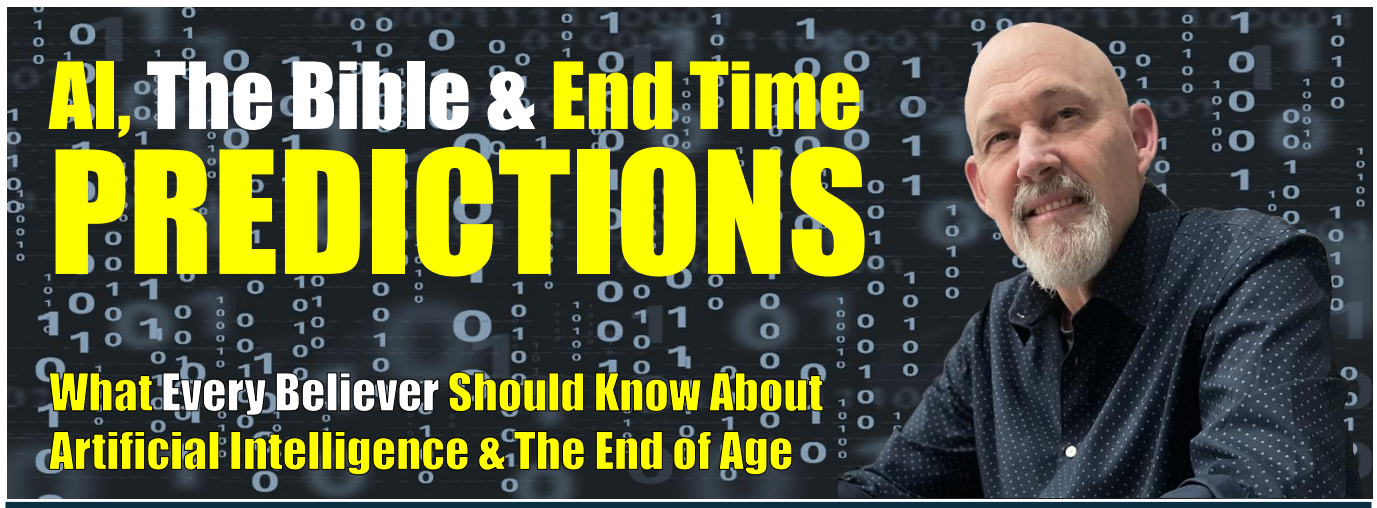




End Times Study Outline – A Snapshot

- *Explanation:* Severe food shortages will devastate populations as a direct result of war and ecological disasters.
- **Death**
 - *Scripture:* Revelation 6:8
 - *Explanation:* A quarter of the earth's population will die from war, hunger, disease, and wild beasts.
- **Global Uncertainty and Chaos**
 - *Scripture:* Luke 21:26
 - *Explanation:* Fear and anxiety will grip humanity as traditional systems fail and the future looks entirely unpredictable.

II. The Desperation of Humanity

The severity of the global crisis drives mankind to seek extraordinary intervention.

- **Desire for Peace, a Solution, Restoration, and a New Beginning**
 - *Scripture:* 1 Thessalonians 5:3
 - *Explanation:* Plagued by chaos, humanity will desperately crave a leader who can promise safety, economic stability, and global unity.

III. The False Return of Jesus

As the global crisis deepens, a counterfeit messiah will emerge to bring a false peace, utilizing spiritual deception to mimic the prophesied return of Christ.

- **The Rise of the Deceiver**
 - *Scripture:* Matthew 24:24, 2 Thessalonians 2:9-10
 - *Explanation:* A charismatic leader known as the Antichrist will appear on the world stage, presenting himself as a divine savior and using counterfeit signs and wonders to mislead humanity.
- **Counterfeit Miracles and Visual Illusions**
 - *Scripture:* Revelation 13:13-14
 - *Explanation:* The False Prophet will perform great signs, even making fire come down from heaven to the earth in the sight of men, completely tricking the world into worshipping the beast.
- **The Image of the Beast**
 - *Scripture:* Revelation 13:15
 - *Explanation:* Satanic power will give breath to an image of the beast, causing it to speak and demanding complete devotion from all inhabitants of the earth.

- **Global Spiritual Delusion**
 - *Scripture:* 2 Thessalonians 2:11-12, 1 Timothy 4:1
 - *Explanation:* God will send a strong delusion upon those who rejected the truth, leaving people to follow seducing spirits, doctrines of devils, and a massive spiritual lie.

IV. The Rise of the Antichrist

Amidst world chaos, a deceptive political figure emerges to answer the world's cry for help.

- **Rise During Global Upheaval**
 - *Scripture:* Daniel 7:24, Revelation 13:1
 - *Explanation:* This leader steps into the power vacuum created by the global crisis to seize control of the international stage.
- **Charismatic Leader, Comes in Peace, Silver Tongue**
 - *Scripture:* Daniel 8:23, Daniel 11:21
 - *Explanation:* He will possess immense charm and persuasive speaking skills, winning people over through flattery and deceptive peaceful promises.
- **Claims He Can Unite the World**
 - *Scripture:* Daniel 9:27
 - *Explanation:* He will orchestrate a peace covenant, promising to solve the world's most deep-rooted conflicts.
- **The World Will Embrace Him, Desperate for Peace**
 - *Scripture:* Revelation 13:3-4
 - *Explanation:* Amazed by his abilities, the desperate global population will willingly follow his leadership and surrender their authority to him.

V. The Great Tribulation and Deception

The true nature of this leader is revealed halfway through his political reign.

- **Three and a Half Years into His Reign, He Will Turn Diabolical**
 - *Scripture:* Daniel 9:27, Revelation 13:5
 - *Explanation:* Exactly midway through the seven-year period, he will break his peace agreement and reveal his true evil intent.
- **Demand to Be Worshipped and Demand Loyalty**
 - *Scripture:* 2 Thessalonians 2:4, Revelation 13:15
 - *Explanation:* He will outlaw all other religions, demanding total allegiance and worship from every person on earth.
- **Set Up in the Temple**
 - *Scripture:* Matthew 24:15, Daniel 11:31

- *Explanation:* He will commit the "abomination of desolation" by defiling the rebuilt Jewish temple in Jerusalem.
 - **Claim to Be the Messiah and Demand to Be Worshipped as God**
 - *Scripture:* 2 Thessalonians 2:4
 - *Explanation:* Exalting himself above everything, he will declare himself to be God incarnate and demand divine honors.
 - **If You Don't, You Will Suffer His Wrath**
 - *Scripture:* Revelation 13:16-17, Revelation 20:4
 - *Explanation:* A brutal system of persecution will begin, execution or economic starvation facing anyone who refuses his mark or worships his image.

New Testament Study Resources



Matthew

- **Matthew 24:** The Olivet Discourse, where Jesus outlines the signs of the end of the age, the abomination of desolation, the Great Tribulation, and His Second Coming.



Mark

- **Mark 13:** Mark's account of the Olivet Discourse, emphasizing the need for vigilance, enduring persecution, and watching for the unexpected return of the Son of Man.



Luke

- **Luke 21:** Luke's account of Jesus' prophecy, highlighting the destruction of Jerusalem as a historic pattern, global distress, and the emotional anxiety of mankind.



1 Thessalonians

- **1 Thessalonians 4:** Outlines the concept of the Rapture, where living believers are caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air.
- **1 Thessalonians 5:** Discusses the sudden and unexpected nature of the Day of the Lord, comparing it to labor pains upon a pregnant woman.



2 Thessalonians

- **2 Thessalonians 1:** Assures believers that God will grant relief from persecution when Jesus returns in flaming fire to deal out retribution to the rebellious.
- **2 Thessalonians 2:** Explains that the Day of the Lord will not come until the apostasy happens, and the "Man of Lawlessness" (Antichrist) is revealed in the temple.



2 Peter

- **2 Peter 3:** Warns against end-time scoffers who doubt the Second Coming and describes the ultimate destruction and renewal of the heavens and earth by fire.



Revelation

- **Revelation 1:** Introduction to the vision, displaying the glorified Christ instructing John to write down what he sees.
- **Revelation 2 & 3:** Letters to the seven literal churches of Asia Minor, containing warnings and promises relevant to believers throughout history and the final age.
- **Revelation 4:** A vision of the heavenly throne room, establishing God's absolute sovereignty before judgments are unleashed on earth.
- **Revelation 5:** The presentation of the seven-sealed scroll, which only the Lamb of God (Jesus) is worthy to open.
- **Revelation 6:** The opening of the first six seals, initiating the Tribulation with war, economic collapse, famine, death, and cosmic disturbances.
- **Revelation 7:** The sealing of the 144,000 Jewish servants and a vision of a countless multitude from every nation who come out of the Great Tribulation.
- **Revelation 8:** The opening of the seventh seal, introducing the first four trumpet judgments that devastate the earth's ecology.
- **Revelation 9:** The fifth and sixth trumpets, which unleashes devastation and a massive eastern army that slays a third of mankind.
- **Revelation 10:** An angel gives John a little scroll to eat, signifying that he must prophesy further bittersweet truths about the final judgments.
- **Revelation 11:** The ministry and death of the Two Witnesses in Jerusalem, followed by the sounding of the seventh trumpet.
- **Revelation 12:** A symbolic vision detailing the cosmic warfare between Satan and Israel, resulting in Satan being cast down to earth to persecute God's people.
- **Revelation 13:** The rise and description of the Antichrist and the False Prophet, the enforcement of the Mark of the Beast, and global forced worship.
- **Revelation 14:** A series of announcements regarding the ultimate triumph of the 144,000, warnings against taking the mark, and a vision of the final harvest of wrath.

- **Revelation 15:** The preparation in heaven for the final seven plagues, introducing the seven angels holding the bowls of God's wrath.
- **Revelation 16:** The rapid-fire pouring out of the seven bowl judgments, causing severe sores, turning seas to blood, scorching heat, darkness, and the gathering at Armageddon.
- **Revelation 17:** The description and ultimate destruction of "Mystery Babylon," representing the corrupt global religious and political system of the end times.
- **Revelation 18:** The sudden, catastrophic fall of the commercial and economic system of Babylon, causing the merchants of the earth to mourn.
- **Revelation 19:** Heaven's praise over Babylon's fall, the Marriage Supper of the Lamb, and the physical Second Coming of Jesus to defeat the Antichrist's armies.
- **Revelation 20:** The binding of Satan, the 1,000-year millennial reign of Christ, the final rebellion, and the Great White Throne Judgment.
- **Revelation 21:** The creation of a new heaven and a new earth, and the descent of the New Jerusalem where God dwells with humanity.
- **Revelation 22:** Final descriptions of the eternal state, the River of Life, and Christ's parting promise that He is coming quickly.

Old Testament Study Resources



Daniel

- **Daniel 2:** Prophetic dream of a giant statue outlining future world empires that lead up to the final kingdom established by God.
- **Daniel 7:** Vision of four beasts representing historical empires, culminating in a terrifying final beast and the rise of a boastful little horn (the Antichrist).
- **Daniel 8:** Prophecy of a vision involving a ram and a goat, foreshadowing the rise of a fierce, deceptive ruler in the latter days.
- **Daniel 9:** The "Seventy Weeks" prophecy, which establishes the specific timeline for the final seven-year period of human history (the Tribulation).
- **Daniel 11:** Highly detailed prophecy of regional conflicts that transition into a description of the final world dictator's military campaigns.
- **Daniel 12:** Focuses on the unprecedented time of distress at the end of the age, the resurrection of the dead, and the sealing of the prophecy until the end times.



Isaiah

- **Isaiah 13:** Prophecy concerning the ultimate destruction of Babylon, framing it within the cosmic judgments of the "Day of the Lord."
- **Isaiah 24:** Known as "Isaiah's Apocalypse," it describes the complete devastation of the entire earth under divine judgment for breaking God's laws.
- **Isaiah 25:** A victory song celebrating the end of suffering, the swallowing up of death, and the ultimate restoration of God's people.
- **Isaiah 26:** A song of trust in God's judgment, advising His people to hide themselves until the indignation and wrath pass over the earth.

- **Isaiah 34:** A vivid depiction of the Lord's fury and slaughter unleashed against all rebellious nations during the global day of vengeance.



Ezekiel

- **Ezekiel 38:** Details the invasion of Israel by a massive northern coalition of nations led by a ruler named Gog in the latter days.
- **Ezekiel 39:** Describes the supernatural defeat of Gog's invading armies upon the mountains of Israel and the subsequent cleansing of the land.



Joel

- **Joel 1:** Uses a devastating plague to introduce the concept of the terrifying, impending "Day of the Lord."
- **Joel 2:** Describes an unstoppable invading army, a call to global repentance, and the promise of cosmic signs paired with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
- **Joel 3:** Details the final judgment of the hostile gentile nations gathered in the Valley of Jehoshaphat and the ultimate blessing of Jerusalem.



Zechariah

- **Zechariah 12:** Prophesies the siege of Jerusalem by all nations of the earth and the supernatural mourning of Israel when they recognize their Messiah.
 - **Zechariah 13:** Describes the refinement of the remnant of Israel through severe trials and the cleansing of the nation from sin and idolatry.
 - **Zechariah 14:** Details the final battle for Jerusalem, the physical return of the Lord to the Mount of Olives, and the establishment of His millennial reign.
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
