Education Scholarship Assistance Program

A scholarship is an empowerment and a statement of a young person's potential. We believe in the power of education and wish to invest in the next generation of leaders by offering annual scholarships and need-based grants to help students of diverse backgrounds with extenuating financial circumstances reduce the economic burden of their education and help ensure that the doors to secondary and postsecondary opportunities are open to students who consistently achieve top grades, who have the potential to succeed and are looking for an exceptional education in an environment which values individuals for who they are and are willing to help themselves. These annual scholarships and grants will be awarded to United States Citizens who are high school, undergraduate, graduate, or community college students. These scholarships and grants are highly competitive, and potential students must demonstrate an elevated level of academic excellence, community involvement, and leadership qualities, with at least a 3.75 GPA, substantial financial need, and have been accepted to or presently attend an accredited prep school, four-year college, or university. Students receiving these scholarships must complete a concentration of electives in either Business, Finance, Medicine, Engineering, Technology, or Education, and graduate with a degree creating a foundation for a successful career. Before the end of each semester, the New Day Outreach Scholarship Committee will review the student's grades, progress toward their degree, and satisfactory record of conduct, to determine whether to continue the scholarship. The Committee may also revoke scholarships during the academic year based on a similar review. Students must maintain a 3.75 GPA throughout their school years. The award will be terminated if any student fails to complete all courses to satisfy their school's requirements to maintain a 3.75 GPA. These awards are limited to tuition, academic fees, books, and curriculum-required materials not covered by financial aid, loans, grants, or other scholarships. They cannot be applied to non-tuition expenses such as room and board. A fundamental principle of awarding these scholarships is that every student, parent, or legal guardian should contribute to their education to the extent of their ability, saving graduates from huge loan debt that can significantly affect their lives.
