

Member Art Pope

Art Pope is a name familiar to many in the Henry Ford Heritage Association, especially those also connected to the Ford Piquette Avenue Plant Museum. Art has headed up the Window Team there since its inception in 2003 and has worked tirelessly on the project of restoring the museum's windows for over 20 years. Over 40 volunteers have served on Art's window team and all of the windows are now fully restored. In that time the Window Team has expanded to include masons who repair and replace the museum's brick and mortar as well as carpenters who maintain and replace the aging flooring in the museum. Art has also been a strong supporter of the museum beyond his volunteer time, serving on the board of trustees for decades as well. Art says that "My 20 years leading the window team at the Piquette Plant has been the highlight of my retirement years."

Art's passion for Piquette and all things Ford might have come from his 36 years as the Executive Engineer for Ford Motor Company in Brazil. Beside The Henry Ford Heritage Association and the Piquette Museum, Art is a member of The Early Ford V-8 Club, Thunderbird International, The Lincoln Highway Association, and the Military Vehicle Preservation Association. Yes, beyond Fords, Art is passionate about preserving and restoring WWII military vehicles. You might recall Art's excellent article in the Spring 2023 issue of the Ford Legend "The Ford Jeep Story".

Of his long-time membership in the Henry Ford Heritage Association, Art will tell you "I believe I was born with Ford Blue blood in my veins. When I was 15 years old, I bought a Model A Ford ever before getting a drivers license. I drove a Model A through High School and College so when I interviewed for a job after graduation, Ford Motor Company was my first choice. Living in Dearborn for 35 years and visiting the Fair Lane Estate for many wedding receptions and other events I was eager to support the estate and other Ford properties by becoming a member of the HFHA."


End of the season cruise to



Tech Talk

Classic Thunderbird Maintenance Tech-Tips

The subject of this month's tech-tip is hoist lifting your convertible Thunderbird. Extra care should be taken when lifting convertible vehicles on a hoist for service purposes. Symmetrically spaced LH & RH contact points should be maintained. Uneven loading can sometimes affect door alignment; all 1955-1957 Thunderbirds have a robust welded frame with extra X-members to maintain body stiffness. 1955-1957 Thunderbirds hoist contact points that take full advantage of this design are shown in the attached photo.

Classic Thunderbird Maintenance Tech-Tips Cont.

Later Thunderbirds starting in 1958, were unibody design vehicles. Full frames were replaced with thicker gauge sheet metal sections at the rocker panel and rear spring hanger sections. These locations have increased structure stiffness for supporting hoist lifting. A general rule is to maintain LH & RH hoist contact point spacing under the front door pillar to the end of the rear seat roughly the length of the cockpit.

It was during this time that he met and married the 'second love of his life' and many more wonderful memories were made. One of the most precious was driving his pregnant wife to the hospital where his first child was born.


